Archery, Engineering, Rifle Shooting, Aviation, Inventing, Robotics, Composite Materials, Mining in Society, Shotgun Shooting, Drafting, Model Design and Building, Electronics, Railroading

If prerequisites are not completed, they can complete these requirements later.

Ideas for shows include - but are not limited to - those found on PBS (NOVA), Discovery Channel, Science Channel, National Geographic Channel, TED Talks (online videos), and the History Channel.
