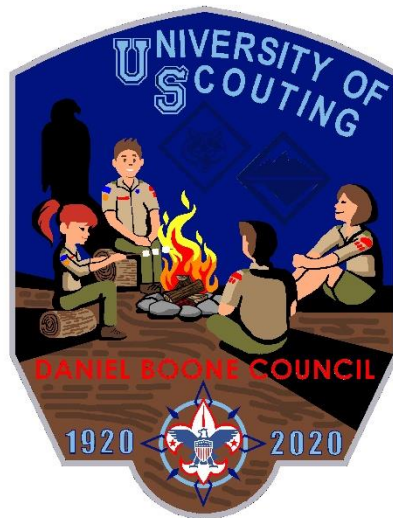

General Information

The University of Scouting is a fun-filled, hands-on training event and an opportunity to network with other Scouters. This one-day training event is designed for **ALL** Cub Scout and Scouts BSA Leaders and parents. In addition, we have training opportunities for Scouts BSA youth as well as a Cub Scout Adventures program throughout the day for Cub Scouts with a parent onsite for the University. There is also an opportunity to take Leader Position-Specific training for your Scouting position.

The University of Scouting courses are designed to help YOU improve your skills and increase your knowledge about Cub Scouting, Scouts BSA, Commissioner Service and related subjects. Learn how Scouting works through interactive training and true to life examples of how to make the program a positive life experience for today's youth. The course selection is varied so that regardless of unit position, you will gain something to take back and implement in your unit.

Participants may register for courses in any of the course areas. For example, a Cub Scout Leader may register for a Scouts BSA or General Education course. Be sure to look at **all** the courses before you choose your classes. Our goal is for Scouters to increase their knowledge by experiencing the different areas of the Scouting program.

Location: Hominy Baptist Church, 135 Candler School Road, Candler, NC 28715

Directions:

From Asheville- I-40 West to Exit 44. Rt at light at end of ramp onto 19/23 South. In about 3.3 miles turn left onto Old Highway 19/23 at Kubota Equipment. In about 1 mile turn left onto Candler School Rd., church is on the right.

From Canton- 1-40 East to Exit 37. Rt at end of ramp and turn left at light onto Hwy 19/23 North. In about 2 miles turn right at light onto Fairmont Rd. After about a half mile, Fairmont Rd. crosses Old Hwy 19/23 and becomes Candler School Rd. The church is on the right.

Registration

Registration can be submitted online on the Council website or via the paper application attached – online registration is preferred for current course availability. Registration should be received in the Daniel Boone Council office by 5:00pm on Friday, March 1, 2020. The University reserves the right to cancel courses or make appropriate changes in order to accommodate the largest number of Scouters. The University of Scouting reserves the right to cancel classes without a minimum of 3 students.

Onsite registration will be open; however, lunch will not be available for walk-ins and individual course registration is subject to availability and may not be available for walk-in selection.

Scouts BSA youth may choose from Den Chief training, the available merit badge offerings, or other University courses. Cub Scouts may register for all-day programming (CS200) if a parent is present as a student or instructor AND onsite all day.

Registrations received by the March 1 deadline will receive a University of Scouting 2020 patch, lunch, and course completion recognition as appropriate.

Fees:

- Participant - \$15 – Classes, lunch, patch
- Participant - \$10 – Classes and patch (no lunch)
- Instructor - \$10 – Classes, lunch, patch

Event Day

What you'll need:

- Bring a pen and paper
- Be sure to check the registration notes for individual classes, as you may need additional items
- Bring someone who has never attended the University of Scouting!

Attire:

Scouts and Scouters should wear the complete and proper uniform of the Boy Scouts of America for the program you are registered with. There is no uniform expectation for any parents attending classes. Some classes will be outside. Be sure to bring layers to help you stay warm and comfortable.

Course Descriptions

Class - SCOUTS BSA	Description
BS101: Merit Badge Counselor Training Adam Cheadle Session 4 1 hour <i>Adult registrations only. No youth.</i>	Who can be a MB Counselor? How do you become one? Learn the responsibility and methods of counseling Scouts as their Merit Badge Counselor.
BS102: Introducing New Parents Into the Troop Julie Pacilli Session 3 1 hour	As Scouts crossover each year, do you have an organized way to get the information you need from their parents and provide the information they need? We'll discuss ideas for a unit New Parent Orientation and what information to share with new families.

<p>BS103: Teaching the Patrol Method Adam Cheadle Session 1 1 hour</p>	<p>Is your Troop truly Youth Led? Find out what the Patrol Method really is, and why it is still the best way to work with Scouts and ensure they succeed in Scouting. We will explore the meaning and intent by Scouting's founder, Robert Baden-Powell and further encouraged by Green Bar Bill - William Hillcourt. Get your Troop on the right path by understanding the system, avoiding the pitfalls and setting up your youth leaders for success.</p>
<p>BS104: Orienteering for Troops Rich Alter Sessions 5 and 6 2 hours</p>	<p>The purpose of this class is to empower youth and adults to explore the outdoors safely by utilizing map and compass. Not all areas have cell service! Get back to basics and learn how to share these skills with youth in your unit.</p>
<p>BS105: Incredible Hikes of WNC Adam Cheadle Session 6 1 hour</p>	<p>Adam has led many Hikes for youth and adults from Church Groups and Scouts in the mountains of North Carolina. Let him explain the many trails there are for you and your Scouts to explore.</p>
<p>BS106: Life to Eagle and Eagle Coaching James Leveritt Sessions 2 and 3 2 hours</p>	<p>This class for Troop level Scouts and their parents (If desired) to learn the steps to prepare for the Eagle Advancement. The merit badges needed, the Eagle mentor, the eagle Workbook and the Eagle Project are included.</p> <p>Eagle Coaches have the responsibility during the planning and enacting of a Scout's Eagle Project to guide the Eagle Candidate. Learn the requirements and changes that are taking place and methods of counseling scouts.</p>
<p>BS107: Eagle Board of Reviews James Leveritt Session 4 1 hour</p>	<p>Only trained/designated people can sit on an Eagle Board of Review. It is a volunteer duty that requires commitment and responsibility to the ideals of scouting. Learn what these responsibilities are and get trained so that you can help an Eagle on his or her journey. Volunteers are needed in all districts!</p>
<p>BS201: Traffic Safety Merit Badge Michael Rector and Melissa Rector Sessions 1, 2, and 3 3 hours <i>Requires signed blue card from unit.</i></p>	<p>Staying safe in traffic wherever you live is getting more difficult all the time, as more and more people take to the road. Earning the Traffic Safety merit badge will give Scouts some crucial tools to stay safer, when driving a car on a highway, riding a bike across town, or jogging across a busy street.</p>

<p>BS202: Collections Merit Badge Melissa Rector and Michael Rector Sessions 4, 5, and 6 3 hours <i>Requires signed blue card from unit. Bring sample of something you collect and be prepared to talk about it. No coins or stamps.</i></p>	<p>Collecting can be an educational and financially rewarding pastime: a collector must educate himself about a specific subject, be able to tell which items are worth preserving, how to catalog and organize his collection, and how to evaluate the value of items.</p>

<p>CS101: Webelos/AOL to Scout Transition Wendy Henderson Session 6 1 hour</p>	<p>Learn how to best prepare Webelos and AOL Scouts for the transition to a Troop and how to get the Scouts excited to continue their Scouting journey.</p>
<p>CS102: Plan B Den Meetings Bridget Monroe Session 5 1 hour</p>	<p>Oh no! A leader canceled at the last minute and didn't share the meeting plans with you! What do you do?!? Learn how to handle these situations and how to always be prepared with a Plan B meeting.</p>
<p>CS103: Awesome Pack Meetings Nick Litsas Session 1 1 hour</p>	<p>Learn how to run a fun and engaging pack meeting and what the critical elements that every pack meeting should have.</p>
<p>CS104: Cub Scout Crafts Kay Thorp Session 2 1 hour</p>	<p>Don't be afraid of crafts! This class will give you easy, fun and low-cost craft ideas to take back to your den and pack. You will get to make and take home several crafts!</p>
<p>CS105: Cub Scout Games Phil Winchester Session 1 1 hour</p>	<p>Let the Cub Scout Games begin! Who doesn't like playing games? Learn how to play games at Den and Pack Meetings. Some games have a purpose, but all are FUN!!!!</p>
<p>CS106: Cub Scout Songs Phil Winchester Session 2 1 hour</p>	<p>This course covers WHY songs are so important for a successful program, and HOW anybody can lead songs - there is NO talent required. Of course, we will provide some fun songs to take back to your pack and den!</p>
<p>CS107: Whittling Chip 101 Cody Stanberry Session 3 1 hour <i>Bring a knife, sharpening stone, and bar of Ivory soap. Be sure to bring the name brand Ivory.</i></p>	<p>Instruction for Cub Scout leaders on how to teach the Whittling Chip to Cub Scouts. Review knife styles and tools and practice whittling your own soap shape. Bring a knife, sharpening stone, and bar of soap.</p>
<p>CS108: Cub Scouts Beyond the Adventures Ronnie Watson Session 5 1 hour</p>	<p>There are a lot of recognitions that Cub Scouts can earn other than their rank adventures. Learn about World Conservation, Religious Emblems, Messenger of Peace, STEM NOVA, and PALA.</p>
<p>CS109: Woodworking with Cub Scouts Jud Gowin Session 2 1 hour</p>	<p>Wood projects are fun and a great hands-on activity. Bears have a requirement for it & Webelos/AoL have an elective. Come learn how to do them in a fun but safe way. Learn projects you can take back to your Den.</p>

<p>CS200: Cub Scout Adventures Karen McGrade, Grady McGrade Sessions 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 6 hours <i>A parent must be on-site at all times attending classes for a Cub Scout to attend.</i></p>	<p>From its beginning, the Scouting movement has taught young people to do their best, to do their duty to God and country, to help others, and to prepare them physically, mentally, and morally to meet these goals. During the day, Cub Scouts will be practicing the promise and law as we have fun with Elective Belt Loops. We will also break up the day with games, songs and outdoor activities.</p>
<p>Class - GENERAL INTEREST</p>	<p>Description</p>
<p>GN101: Youth Protection Sue Persons Sessions 1 and 2 2 hours</p>	<p>This class covers Youth Protection issues as required by BSA National. Youth Protection Certification is required every two years for all registered Scout Leaders.</p>
<p>GN103: Fundamentals of Training Peggy Jones Sessions 1, 2, and 3 3 hours</p>	<p>The Fundamentals of Training course is designed to help Scouters and current BSA trainers, regardless of their experience, to present effective training. Emphasis will be focused on the principles of how people learn, understanding the primary methods of instruction used by the BSA, and practicing the BSA's training techniques. This course is the first part of the train-the-trainer continuum and is a required course for Pack Trainers. It is open to adult and youth trainers.</p>
<p>GN104: Wood Badge 101/ Introduction to NYLT for Youth David Kayne Session 6 1 hour</p>	<p>If you haven't attended Wood Badge, your idea of Wood Badge could be obsolete! Learn how this vital training course will benefit you as a leader and how the Leadership skills you learn will apply to your day-to-day work. NYLT is advanced training for youth in Scouts BSA using similar techniques as Wood Badge. After a successful course in 2016 and 2018 we are excited to prepare for future NYLT Courses. Learn how NYLT elevates youth leadership skills for participants to use in Units and Life.</p>
<p>GN105: Unit Budgeting and Fundraising Laurie Beitler Session 4 1 hour</p>	<p>What powers your unit? Popcorn sales? Camp Card sales? Something else? Will you have enough funds to cover recharter fees? What about that large trip you want to take? Learn the basics of unit budgeting and fundraising 101.</p>
<p>GN106: Journey to Excellence Training Alice Courtland Session 1 1 hour</p>	<p>JTE is the BSA's tool for helping leaders plan their program, monitor progress, and assess their unit's success. Come learn about the "scorecards" used and how the standards are designed to help all sized units succeed.</p>

<p>GN107: Incredible Campfires Brian Brackins Session 5 1 hour</p>	<p>Campfires are a Scouting tradition that should create life-long memories for your Scouts. We will cover to how make the most of the campfire experience, how to engage Scouts in the fun, how to plan the agenda to set proper tone and tempo, campfire do's and don'ts, and sources for captivating story-telling and CM/DL/SM minutes.</p>
<p>GN108: Dutch Oven Cooking Basics Jennifer Welch Sessions 2 and 3 2 hours</p>	<p>One Pot Wonderful Meals cooked in a Dutch Oven. Learn the best methods and the tools you will need to cook dutch oven dinners and desserts. Taste the terrific foods that you can be making at your next camp-out. You will also learn the art of keeping your cast iron in the best condition and get a few recipes to take back to your unit.</p>
<p>GN109: Knots Chris Williams Session 4 1 hour</p>	<p>Learn basic Scout knots and hitches required for advancement at both the Cub Scout and Troop levels and how to teach them to Scouts.</p>
<p>GN110: Lashings Chris Williams Session 5 1 hour</p>	<p>Learn basic lashings and fun ways to teach and use them to make useful camp gadgets.</p>
<p>GN111: Flag Etiquette Kay Thorp Session 1 1 hour</p>	<p>Learn how to properly handle the American Flag and how to teach the youth how to show it its proper respect. This class is suitable for Pack and Troop leaders as well as and Scouts 2nd class and above.</p>
<p>GN112: Meaningful Service Projects Rich Alter Session 1 1 hour</p>	<p>While all service projects are meaningful, each leader and youth can find opportunities to help organizations or communities that are closest to their hearts. While working together on these most meaningful projects, they will have the chance to make a difference as a team and share their passion for those that they are working for. Learn about the Messengers of Peace program which shows the impact we have on our communities and the world.</p>
<p>GN113: BSA Leave No Trace 101 Peggy Jones Sessions 4, 5 and 6 3 hours</p>	<p>This course will introduce the seven principles of Leave No Trace ethics and skills. It is designed to help youth and adults within all Scouting Programs understand the importance of following them in outdoor activities. Additional resources and opportunities will be covered.</p>
<p>GN114: Working with Special Needs Scouts Kathy Emory Session 4 1 hour</p>	<p>Scouts of all abilities can participate in BSA's programs. Come learn how to include them and help them succeed.</p>

<p>GN115: Conflict Resolution Winston Shearin Session 6 1 hour</p>	<p>We all find ourselves facing conflict. Conflict often comes from differences of opinion or personality, misunderstandings, anger, or miscommunication. We practice conflict resolution tools to ensure that conflict doesn't become a lasting problem.</p>
<p>GN116: Scoutbook 101 Julie Pacilli Session 5 1 hour</p>	<p>This amazing program used by many for years to manage all aspects of their Troop or Pack will become the official (and the only) way for all Units of the BSA to enter advancement. Learn about the management tools available to help your Pack or Troop go!</p>

No youth.</i></p>	<p>This is a required position specific course to be officially trained as a Cub Master. What is the Cub Master's role? Learn how to make pack meetings extra special, plus learn tips from someone who has been there and knows how to incorporate the scout program.</p>
<p>PS102: Den Leader Position Specific Training Kay Thorp Sessions 4 and 5 2 hours <i>Adult registrations only. No youth.</i></p>	<p>Learn the program procedures to run a successful den for all Cub Scout ranks. Learn how to make meetings fun, while keeping the youth involved and advancing. This course is open to den leaders for all ranks. Learn from a currently active leader.</p>
<p>PS103: SM/ASM Position Specific Training Alpo Portelli, David Kayne, and Adam Cheadle Sessions 2, 3, 4 and 5 4 hours <i>Adult registrations only. No youth.</i></p>	<p>Scout Master and Assistant Scoutmaster Indoor Job Specific Training for any SM/ASM, especially new leaders but a great refresher for others. Troop Committee Members and Parents are welcome!</p>
<p>PS104: Den Chief Position Training Peyton Douglas Sessions 1, 2 and 3 3 hours <i>Youth registrations only.
